Hero cop killed in Bronx during hand-to-hand struggle with armed suspect (9/29/19)

A hero NYPD officer was fatally shot early Sunday during a desperate, hand-to-hand struggle with an armed suspect just after midnight on the grounds of the Edenwald Houses in The Bronx. Officer Brian Mulkeen, 33, a six-year veteran of the department, did not survive three gunshot injuries, Chief of Department Terence Monahan told reporters at Jacobi Hospital, where doctors had worked to save his life.

Sources said Mulkeen had been shot with his own weapon in the head, chest and legs as he and the suspect wrestled on the ground.

The suspect, too, was fatally shot. "Five officers at the location fired their service weapons, striking the man," Monahan said.

The fallen officer's last words, recorded by his body-camera as he wrestled on the ground with the suspect, were "He's reaching for it! He's reaching for it!" Monahan told reporters.

Moments later, "numerous shots" were fired, he said.

"Officer Mulkeen's gun fired five times," Monahan said. "At this point, it is not clear who fired Officer Mulkeen's gun."

The suspect's gun, a 32 caliber revolver, did not appear to have been fired, he said.

"As cops we know how rewarding our profession can be," the chief added, his sadness apparent in his voice.

"But I'll tell you: There is absolutely no worse moment on our job than this. As we stand here this morning, a young man with a bright future who courageously patrolled some of New York City's toughest streets has tragically lost his life."

The deadly encounter happened just after 12:30 a.m., as Mulkeen and two fellow plainclothes officers with the Bronx Borough Anti-Crime Unit, which is based in the nearby 47th Precinct, hopped out of their vehicle to speak with the suspected gang member, Monahan said.

"They were there because of gang activity that included recent shootings," Monahan said.

The suspect, whose name was not released early Sunday, broke into a run, Monahan said.

It was Mulkeen — who lived in Yorktown Heights with his girlfriend, also a cop in The Bronx, with the 44th Precinct — who caught up with the suspect and tackled him first.

It was unclear at what point it had become apparent that the suspect was armed.

"He had a 32 cal revolver. He was seen reaching for his gun," Monahan said.

"Officer Mulkeen was on the ground wrestling with the suspect for an extended period of time," before the gunfire erupted, Monahan said.

The 27-year-old gunman was on probation until 2022 for a narcotics-related arrest from last year, the chief said, and had a burglary conviction from Rockland County. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

Mulkeen "was a great cop," the chief added. "Just last night he arrested a man for possession of a gun in this very same precinct."

Mayor de Blasio joined Monahan and PBA President Pat Lynch in asking all of New York to pray for Mulkeen's heartbroken family — and his grieving NYPD family.

"This is a very, very sad day for our city," Mayor de Blasio said at the press conference.

"We lost a hero this evening ... This is a young man who made a choice to join the NYPD and put his life on the line." (Hero continued on next page)

Mulkeen's mother and father, sister and girlfriend had rushed to Jacobi hospital, the mayor said. "We broke the news to them and one of the things they told us, even though their grief, was that Brian made a choice. He wanted to leave civilian life ... he wanted to protect our city ... he gave his life for all of us."

A shaken Lynch called the suspect, "This soulless individual," and lamented of the family, "Their hero — our hero — is not coming home."

Earlier Sunday, police radio transmissions <u>had recorded the worried panic of officers at the scene</u>. "Shots fired shots fired guys! I need a bus! I need a bus!" a male officer shouted, using police jargon for an ambulance.

"Laconia and 229!" another shouted of the shooting location.

"There was a cop lying on the floor and another guy who looked like he'd been shot in the eye," witness Sara Diaz, 56, told The Post. "Oh my god, I got so nervous."

Chelsea cops say they're 'under attack' by vindictive police captain

Cops in Chelsea's police precinct claim they are being tormented by a vindictive captain, their union alleges in a letter.

"You are under attack!!!!" reads an open letter to the members of the 10th Precinct that was obtained by The Post. "Captain Kevin J. Coleman is attacking you and your families."

The Police Benevolent Association letter, signed by the Manhattan South Trustee John Flynn and Manhattan South Financial Secretary Merritt Riley, accuses Coleman of changing assignments with no regard for officers' home lives.

It also alleges PBA delegates had their shifts changed after standing up for their fellow cops. "The attacks are not physical, we know that, yet, they are just as dangerous. Captain Kevin J. Coleman is attacking you and your families by creating an extremely hostile work environment," the letter states. The NYPD did not immediately respond to a request for comment on the allegations. The letter goes on to attack Coleman for skipping the Sept. 11 services to adjudicate a complaint against an officer who lost his father in a 9/11-related illness.

"All this comes at a time where we as a department are in the midst of a health crisis," the letter reads, referring to a recent spate of suicides among officers. "When most are trying to find a solution Captain Kevin J. Coleman has done nothing but create a hostile work environment for the members of the 10th Precinct."

The Captains Endowment Association union defended Coleman saying the captain "conducts his command operations in a fair and equitable manner" and clarifying that the compliant he adjudicated last Wednesday "began well before 9/11 and was not intended to coincide or distract from the solemnity of this day of mourning and remembrance."

NYPD cops save marathon trainee's life in Central Park

It was a race to save his life.

A marathon trainee dodged death on the running course over the weekend, thanks to a pair of fastacting NYPD police officers who were hailed as heroes on Wednesday.

The 44-year-old man, who didn't want to be identified, was nearing the end of an 18-mile loop in Central Park on Sunday when he suddenly collapsed in cardiac arrest near West 74th Street and West Drive.

Officers Benjamin Beiro, 30, and Nicholas Noto, 25, sprang into action after getting the 911 call around 9:30 a.m., with Beiro beginning chest compressions on the runner and Noto dashing to get a defibrillator from their patrol car.

"In a condition like this, every second counts," Noto, who has four years on the force, said at a press conference. "So the quicker you get there ... the better the result."

After strapping the pads onto the victim's chest, Beiro continued the compressions while Noto delivered two life-saving counter-shocks that restored the man's pulse.

"Shortly after that, the male began to gasp. We got a faint pulse and he began to wake up," Beiro recalled.

The man regained consciousness just before EMS arrived to transport him to Mount Sinai West hospital. That's when the man's wife — who began searching for him when he didn't cross the finish line as expected — received a call from an emergency room doctor.

"In that moment, the whole world stopped and I feared the worst," she said in a letter to the officers. "The ER doctor on the other end of the phone then said, 'Don't worry, he's going to be OK." Enlarge ImageSeth Gottfried

Both officers visited the victim, who was transported to Mount Sinai St. Luke's.

"He was doing good," said Beiro, who's been with the NYPD for 6½ years. "He definitely expressed a lot of gratitude."

The officer added, "It was definitely one of those moments where you feel great to be doing the job you do, just to be able to help people."

The runner was close to completing the TCS New York City Marathon Training Series 18M — three six-mile loops of Central Park — when his heart gave out.

In a statement, he thanked the cops for their "quick arrival, assessment and actions" that spared his life one week from his first wedding anniversary.

"You are a testament to your excellent training and your dedication to serving your community," the man wrote. "I am personally in awe."

He added that doctors have figured out the "developmental defect" that caused his cardiac arrest and that he's discussing further treatment.

His grateful wife also gushed over the officers' response.

"In the past two days I have thought back to that moment a lot. Because if not for the quick, efficient and effective response from both of you, the worst would have actually happened," she wrote. "I wish you the best in your careers, and hope the same level of kindness comes back to you when you need it most."

It's a Garden of Steven.

Hundreds gathered at Westwood Park in Malverne, Long Island, Saturday morning for the dedication of the "Garden of Forgiveness," which honors the life and legacy of hero NYPD cop Steven McDonald.

The Garden was created to be "a quiet place where people can meditate and reflect" and "present and future generations will come to know the message of Steven McDonald: peace, love and forgiveness," according to its website.

McDonald's wife, Patti Ann, son Conor, his wife, Katie and NYPD Commissioner James O'Neill were among the attendees.

"There was never a finer man than Steven McDonald. The world is a much better place because of him and a much sadder place because he's gone," said Ed Mahoney, who helped spearhead the drive for the Memorial Garden, which features teak benches and a fountain circled by roses and boxwoods.

McDonald was paralyzed after being shot while on patrol in Central Park by a teenager in 1986. He later forgave that teenager, and continued to spread the message of peace and service for the rest of his life. He died in 2017 due to complications from his injuries.



NYPD legend who got 'Son of Sam' confession dead at 99

Retired NYPD Chief of Detectives John Keenan, who stormed Normandy, fought in the Battle of the Bulge and secured a confession from the notorious Son of Sam serial killer has died, police officials announced Friday.

Keenan, who died on Thursday morning of congestive heart failure just three months before his 100th birthday, was a legendary fixture in the department during his decades long tenure that ended in January 1978, police and family said.

"He was called the 'Gentleman's cop'," his daughter Joan Brennan, 66, told The Post Friday in between tears and laughs.

"He was just the most wonderful man. He was a brilliant man, the kind of man that could do the Sunday New York Times crossword puzzle and was interested in everything, any subject, from history to politics."

He leaves behind his wife of 73 years, Sara Keenan, Brennan, five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, the family said. John Keenan also had two daughters who passed before him — Mary Ellen who died at 22 in a plane crash and another Sara who died two years ago from cancer. "My grandfather was an accomplished brilliant man who helped keep New York City and the world safe." John Keenan's grandson Kevin Brennan told The Post.

"More importantly, he was exceedingly humble, honest and kind. He was the finest man I'll ever know and we all miss him dearly."

Keenan, who counted J.D. Sallinger as a lifelong friend after the two met during World War II in the U.S. Army's elite Counter Intelligence Corps, started with the NYPD in 1941 before he was drafted to fight the Nazis across the Atlantic, Joan Brennan recounted.

She said despite her father's many accolades, which also includes the Liberation of Paris, "he never bragged about anything."








DETECTIVE FIRST GRADE RANDOLPH A. HOLDER

n Tuesday, October 20, 2015, Detective Randolph Holder was shot and killed by suspects involved in an armed robbery.

At about 8:30 pm, then-Police Officer Holder, along with other officers, responded to calls of shots being fired in the vicinity of East 102nd Street and First Avenue in the East Harlem section of

Manhattan. Witnesses reported that several male suspects had fled north along a footpath on the FDR Drive. When responding officers arrived, they were informed by a male victim that his bike had been stolen at gunpoint by one of the suspects.

Officer Holder and his partner, assigned to plainclothes Anti-Crime duty, encountered a male on a bicycle heading northbound on a pedestrian overpass of the FDR Drive near East 120th Street. There was an exchange of gunfire between the male suspect and the two officers. During this exchange, Officer Holder was struck fatally in the head.
